Multilingual Know Your Rights Workshop & Immigration Clinic

Friday, February 29, 2008, 11:30AM at the CCSF Downtown Campus

WHAT: The San Francisco Immigrant Legal & Education Network (SFILEN), in collaboration with City College of San Francisco Downtown Campus, will offer a multilingual workshop and legal clinic for immigrants covering a range of topics. This workshop will focus on helping immigrants understand their rights when they encounter immigration customs or immigration enforcement officers. The workshop will be in English, with translation in Chinese and Spanish. A lawyer will be available for questions afterwards.

WHY: Immigration laws and policies are always changing. It is important for people to have timely legal advice and the most updated legal advice to protect their immigration status. SFILEN legal agencies provide FREE legal services in many languages.

Immigration laws affect ALL immigrants: this includes green card holders, student and worker visa holders, and refugees. Immigration questions are complex and affect different areas of a person's life. It is important to seek legal counseling for help with form-filling, travel advice, naturalization, family law, detention and deportation orders, and more.

WHO: The first citywide network of immigrant serving organizations known as the San Francisco Immigrant Legal & Education Network.
