in the upcoming SFUSD School Board Election

1 REVIEW THE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

If you are not a U.S. citizen, you must meet all the requirements below to vote in the upcoming School Board election:

- Resident of San Francisco
- At least 18 years old on February 15, 2022
- Parent, legal guardian, or caregiver of a child under 19 who lives in San Francisco
- Not currently found mentally incompetent to vote by a court
- Not in state or federal prison for a felony conviction

2 REGISTER BY **JAN 31ST, 2022**

Scan the QR code or visit <u>bit.ly/SFimmigrantvote</u> to print the Non-Citizen Voter Registration Form and return it to the Department of Elections by mail or in person at City Hall.



3 VOTE BY **FEB 15**, **2022**

Decide how to vote: by mail or in-person at the City Hall Voting Center or a polling place. Eligible voters that miss the registration deadline can still vote on election day by casting a provisional ballot at the City Hall Voting Center or their assigned polling place. To find your assigned polling place, go to sfelections.org/portal/NCV, call (415) 554-4375, or check the back of your Voter Information Booklet.

NONCITIZEN VOTERS: KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

- Noncitizens are not eligible to vote in any other local, state, or federal election.
- You have the right to get help with registration and voting in your preferred language.
- The information you provide to the Department of Elections when registering, including your name and address, could be accessed by federal agencies, including Immigration and Customs Enforcement.
- Upon request, the Department of Elections can provide a letter explaining your eligibility to vote in San Francisco School Board elections as a noncitizen, as may be needed for the naturalization process.
