- 9. What will you prioritize to ensure the health, success, and longevity of the CCSF Chinatown North Beach campus?

As a first-generation college student, I've seen firsthand the transformative power that a community college education can have. Growing up, my family had limited resources, and like many families, we were just above the cutoffs where significant financial aid would be available. Four-year college wasn't an option, and I went to community college for my associate degree, so I know how important it is to have a campus close to where you live, benefiting the community at large.

Success for the Chinatown campus requires CCSF as a whole to be healthy and stable. I'm running for community college board to bring accountability to CCSF, to increase enrollment numbers, and to right the financial ship. I will champion common sense solutions and transparency to steer CCSF toward stability and regain the trust of our community.

10. What are your goals to increase enrollment at the Chinatown campus?

It's time to think outside the box in order to grow CCSF. To attract more students, we need to revamp our marketing including multilingual campaigns, revitalize our course offerings by working with the academic senate around innovative programs around emerging technologies like AI, reinvest in pipelines like skilled trades, and provide the support our students need like language access. I would also advocate for successful

programs like partnering with our local High Schools to pilot the highly successful Pathways in Technology Early College High Schools (P-TECH) program, which allows students least likely to attend college an opportunity to receive their High School diploma, a credential, or an associate degree. And I would like to expand dual-enrollment opportunities.

I also believe that Free City should continue to provide universal free tuition to San Franciscans regardless of full- or part-time status, course of study, educational goals, age of students, or past academic success. I commit to working with all parties to ensure all San Franciscans can continue to attend City College tuition free.

11. How will you ensure stabilized funding for CCSF Chinatown campus in the next few years?

My focus as a trustee will be to create stability. That includes working to get CCSF off of the accreditation warning, increasing enrollment numbers, saving for retirement and rainy day funds so that cuts aren't "go-to" options, and additional savings for expansion of critical courses that are high in demand. We also need to look into childcare at CCSF campuses as that also remains a barrier to many students attending CCSF. Specific to the Chinatown campus, I support identifying additional revenue streams from grants and working with our local state elected leaders, expanding ESL classes responsibly and as needed, and ensuring that CCSF enrollment remains free for all San Franciscans.

12. If elected to the City College Board of Trustees, what will be your top three priorities and how will you implement change?

As mentioned above, I'm running for community college board to bring accountability to CCSF, to improve enrollment numbers, and to right the financial ship. It's time to rebuild the trust with the community, and continue to expand student services in a financially responsible way so that we do not fall into a financial crisis again. I was a proud supporter of non-citizen parent voting for the Board of Education, and would support a similar action for CCSF as well in order to give so many more people a voice. Thank you!

我也认为,"市立大学免学费"计划应该继续为旧金山人服务,不论是全日制或兼读、无论学 习科目、教育目标、学生年龄或过去的学业成绩如何。我承诺与各方合作,确保所有旧金 山人都能继续免费就读市立大学。

11. 您将如何确保旧金山市立大学华埠校区在未来几年内获得稳定的资金?

作为董事,我的首要任务是为市立大学带来稳定。这包括努力让市立大学摆脱认证警告状态、增加入学人数、为退休金和应急基金储蓄,避免削减预算成为应对困难的惯常手段, 同时为扩充高需求的关键课程增加储备。我们还需要研究在市立大学校区提供托育服务,因为这仍然是许多学生就读市立大学的障碍。我特别针对华埠分校采取措施,我主张通 过补助金和与本地州议员的合作寻找额外收入来源,根据实际需求稳步增设英语作为第二 语言课程,并确保市立大学对所有旧金山人保持免费入学。
