KNOW YOUR RIGHTS IF ICE COMES TO YOUR HOME OR NEIGHBORHOOD

If ICE comes to your door

- 1. Do not open your door. ICE cannot come in without a legal search warrant signed by a judge. Often, ICE will show a DHS warrant in the form of an <u>I-200</u> or an <u>I-205</u> form which is not a warrant signed by a judge. If they do have a legal search warrant, it should be slipped under the door.
- 2. Remain silent. Say "I plead the Fifth Amendment and choose to remain silent." If you do not speak English, ask for an interpreter.
- 3. Do not sign anything. Do not sign any forms without an attorney present or if you cannot understand the documents.

If ICE approaches you on the street

- 1. You have the right to refuse to give them your ID and name.
- 2. You can refuse to answer their questions. If they detain you, you can ask for an attorney.
- 3. You can ask "Am I arrested?" If the answer is no, you should ask him or her if you can leave. You do not need to give them any information regarding your legal status in the U.S. You are not required to provide any documents to them.

If ICE approaches you at your workplace

- 1. Do not provide consent. Ask to see identification. ICE can enter areas open to the general public, e.g., waiting room, at your workplace. However, even in the public areas, ICE cannot arrest or question you without a properly issued warrant.
- 2. Ask for a warrant. If ICE does not produce a valid warrant, you can ask them to leave. If ICE has a warrant, make sure the warrant has the correct address of your workplace. Check the warrant to determine what areas and items ICE is authorized to be searched. ICE cannot search beyond what is identified in the search warrant.
